How Can You Promote Play in Children with Autism?

Incorporate 1 or all of these 3 in your interventions!

Imitate the child

Has strong evidence support

- ✓ Engage child in joint attention (JA) play
- ✓ Follow the child's lead and interests in play activities
- ✓ Imitate materials, verbalizations and intonations used by child

Model for the child

Has moderate to strong evidence support

- ✓ Use an adult or peer to model play
- ✓ Use video modeling
- ✓ Engage child in play dialogue

Modify the play environment

Has moderate evidence support

- ✓ Use visuals to promote understanding and performance
- ✓ Alter sensory features of play environment
- ✓ Try different play partners, such as another adult or a peer

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
